
Specifically, Fisher German will:

- **Promote** a positive culture for employees, increasing their awareness and promoting their ownership of Health and Safety and a sustainable approach to environmental management through communication, active participation and the provision of suitable and adequate training.
- **Provide** and maintain safe working environments that minimise the risks to health, safety, and welfare.
- **Ensure** all employees play an active part in the health, safety and environmental performance of the firm by consulting with them and helping them to understand their responsibilities.
- **Safeguard** employees, others and the environment from foreseeable hazards or impacts connected with work activities, processes and working systems.
- **Provide** adequate guidance, instruction, training, and supervision arrangements to ensure safe and sustainable methods of work.
- **Ensure** all colleagues report adverse events immediately so that the business can respond, investigate, communicate and learn from the findings.

All employees must:

- **Understand** the risks associated with their work and carry out their work safely.
- **Follow** health, safety and environmental training, procedures and instructions and not work in a way that increases risk themselves, others or the environment.
- **Comply** with this policy, health, safety and environmental procedures and the provisions put in place to protect their safety and the safety of the environment.
- **Be proactive** and help keep hazards and environmental impacts to a minimum.
- **Report** any failings in health, safety and environmental procedures or equipment and adverse events.
